To think or not to think, that is not the question. Everyone must choose between good thinking and bad thinking.

I first saw the light of Christianity when I was seventeen. My father professed to be a freethinker and my mother promoted mystical pantheism. From an early age my dad ingrained in me the axiom "Test before you trust." "Think before you try." I have always wanted to know if there is a reason for our existence. Is there a cosmic purpose to the riddle of life? Are we merely the outcome of a cosmic accident? Just a random collection of atoms floating in an infinite space? Is Truth merely an illusion of the mind? Can we discover Meaning in a meaningless Universe? Purpose in an empty space? Is life merely, as Shakespeare puts it "A tale told by an idiot full of sound and fury, signifying nothing?"

Life is greater than logic but to abandon logic in our search for truth is to open the door to dilution. A belief system, that is irrational or inconsistent with reality, fails to compete in the contest for truth. All belief systems cannot be equally true, for the simple reason they contradict one another therefore only one can be true. To suggest that there is no difference between true belief and false belief is to state something incoherent. It is a false belief, a contradictory proposition, and a meaningless statement. In this game, the word right or wrong has no possible meaning. Common sense must prevail in order to escape nonsense.

Only God is great enough to create us, wise enough to guide us, powerful enough to save us, good enough to forgive us, big enough to satisfy us, and worthy enough to worship.

The climate of our time is marked by Apathy and Skepticism. Today many dismiss Christianity as irrelevant, irrational and old fashion. We are frequently told to abandon the old faith in the light of modern science, pluralism and postmodernism.

How do we respond? Is there a way to win the new minds? How do we communicate our faith? Our approach must be Biblical, Relevant, and Logical. God has given us a heart to love him, a will to serve him, and a mind to know him. To ignore the mind is to reject his commandment and disregard his gift. A mindless faith is no better than a blind faith. An unchallenged Skeptic is a bolder Skeptic still. By our ignorance and silence, we encourage the unbeliever in his unbelief (Col 4:6; 1Per 3:15 Pro15: 28).

What must exist for evil to exist? Can we affirm something is wrong without knowing what is right? How can we say something is bad if we can't prove what is good? What is our objective moral ground for moral objections? Where there is no God there is no objective evil. All we have is a subjective view of reality. A subjective view has no logical place in a rational dialogue. Imagine a universe without God; it would be like one blind man telling another how to get lost. Evil is a by-product of that which is good. A bad relationship between the good. Evil has no metaphysical independent existence. It is like blindness, a lack of sight. Like the rust in a car or hole in a garment.

Evil does not question the existence of God but merely his operation. Evil exists because God allows his creatures free will, God is totally good and there is no darkness in him. He never causes evil. Man freely acts their way rather than God's way. We freely choose our way, hence we bring evil into the world. We have corrupted our natural world. God promised to handle evil his way. Because He is ultimately in control, He constantly uses suffering to accomplish good purposes. Suffering does have a purpose.

We suffer because we sin.
We suffer because others sin.
We suffer because we live in a fallen world.
We suffer because God allows us to make choices.

If human actions are to be truly meaningful, then God cannot intercede every time evil takes place. There are some things logicians call meaningless fallacy. There are some things God cannot do because they are meaningless nonsense not because he is powerless. Can God create a stone so heavy He cannot lift it?" Can God create a yellow bird, which isn't yellow? Can God make a square circle a round square? God cannot make Himself cease to exist. God cannot make good evil. He can't make mistakes He can't create a self-contradiction and a meaningless nothing.
